Participants will have a chance to visit and tour the USGS Hammond Bay Biological Station in Millersburg, MI. Formerly a U.S. Life-Saving Service facility (1876-1915) and then part of the U.S. Coast Guard

(1915-1947), Hammond Bay became a federal research facility in 1950, with the primary missions of developing control measures for invasive sea lampreys and conducting research to aid native fish restoration. During the tour we will discuss sea lampreys, the sea lamprey control program coordinated by the Great Lakes Fishery Commission, current research taking place at HBBS (on both sea lamprey and native fish), and finally, have a chance to view live sea lampreys up close.

Lauren Holbrook is a communications associate for the Great Lakes Fishery Commission (GLFC) and **Margaret Spens** is a communications fellow with the GLFC. Both are stationed at Hammond Bay Biological Station along the shore of Lake Huron, near Rogers City.
