Tim Kent, the guest curator at the museum, will discuss how he assembled his extensive prehistoric and historic period collections, over the span of 53 years. He will also describe how he combined them with the Haltiner prehistoric collection of the museum to create many of the new exhibits in the gallery. After Tim's presentation, attendees may take a self-guided tour of the newly opened gallery.

Tim Kent twice received the State History Award from the Historical Society of Michigan. He has authored numerous books about various aspects of the fur trade era, and each of them are considered the encyclopedia on the given subject.

With his wife Doree and their sons Kevin and Ben, the Kent family recreated the lives of French trader of the 1600s and his Native family, during ten summers in wilderness settings. In addition, with their dog Toby, they paddled from end to end the 3,000-mile mainline fur trade canoe route across the U.S. and Canada, from Montreal to Ft. Chipewyan in northern Alberta, over the course of fifteen voyages.



Highlights of Recurring Programs What the Heck is Spitzer by Marilyn Klingshirn


Spitzer is a card game of German origin. It's played in our area of northeast Michigan (Alpena, Rogers City, Posen).

When I was young, Aunt Francie and Uncle Joe Marzean would play Spitzer with my parents at our home on Swan River Road. I, myself, learned the game after I was married. I joined my husband and father-in-law and played in a league at Louie's Bar in Posen in the 1970s.

Spitzer is "normally' played with four players. However, there are adaptions for play with three or five players. We use part of a standard deck of cards. We remove all cards 2-6. I like to say we don't play with a full deck. (Tee Hee)

Spitzer is a trick taking game and the aim is to win tricks containing valuable cards. Although player form **temporary** alliances for each hand—two against two or one against three—they keep separate scores and ultimately play for themselves, the object being to be the first to achieve a score of 42 or more points.

In Spitzer trump is always the same. There are 14 trump—all the queens, jacks, and diamonds. This is the rank of trump cards from high to low with their point value.



The rest of the clubs, spades and hearts are non-trump, called fails (from the German Fehifarbe). The fail in each suit rank from high to low: A, 10, K, 9,8,7.

Oh boy I hope I haven't overwhelmed you. Spitzer is a fun game but we do need to concentrate. Please, come check the game out. Whether you are completely new to the game, haven't played for 32 years or are a seasoned player, you are welcome. We are a patient group! We play for fun, not for blood. Spitzer is played on Thursdays each week from 10:00 to 11:30 am in the M. Briggs Center.
